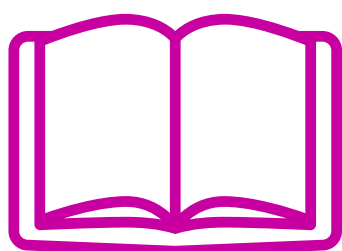

Over 50%

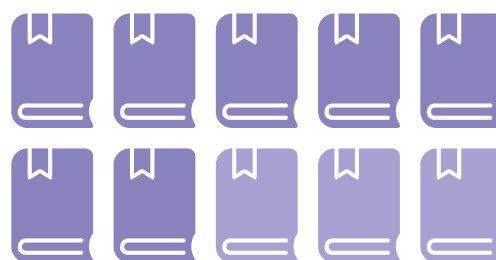
of students made an improvement of

in just 12 weeks.

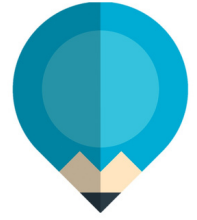


77% of students across the

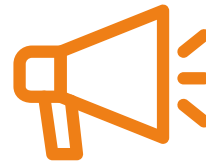
## Pupil Progress



**86%** of students feel **more confident in their writing abilities since the start of term**, with **54%** feeling a lot more confident.



**92%** of parents reported their children seem **more interested in writing** since attending the programme, with **58%** stating they are a lot more interested.



**55%** of students feel **more confident in asking for help in sessions**, with **38%** of these children feeling a lot more confident.

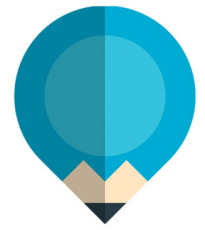

### Term 1 Highlights

#### Nifemi (Year 5)

Nifemi has always been a thoughtful member of Pompey Pirates who can be relied on to quietly concentrate on her writing. Nifemi has worked so hard on her confidence, working with a variety of adults to share and refine her ideas to produce an intriguing story full of mystery. Nifemi now contributes more in group settings and even shares her thoughts and ideas with the whole crew. She started in the Autumn Term with a reading age of 9 years and 1 month and has made 1 year and 7 months progress, ending the first term with a reading age of 10 years and 1 month.

#### Stan Lee (Year 4)

Stan Lee started at Pompey Pirates a few weeks after his peers and could sometimes find his writing tricky to focus on. Over the course of the Autumn Term, he was able to focus on his ability to write for longer periods of time with the support of adults and developed his resilience to produce a funny and exciting story. Stan Lee started at Pompey Pirates with a reading age of 7 years and 2 months and has made 2 years progress, finishing the first term with a reading age of 9 years and 2 months.

#### Elijah (Year 7)

Elijah's confidence has grown since joining us in October. His positive attitude to research and his learning has shone through. Elijah's effort and determination has resulted in him making over a years reading progress in the first three months of being on the programme. When he joined Portsea Sailors, he had a reading age of 8 years and 7 months and our latest reading assessment shows he now has a reading age of 9 years and 11 months.
